At the Gates of the Balkans - Prehistoric communities of the Baranya/Baranja region and the adjacent areas

International round-table conference

and

Institute of Archaeology, Research Centre for the Humanities of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, Budapest

February 23–25, 2017 Pécs, Hungary

Different parts of the historic Baranya/Baranja region, which – in a broader view – incorporate Southeast Transdanubia and Slavonia as well, represented a culturally and historically integral unit for several millennia. In contrast, modern borders divide them into two different worlds by cutting traditional ties. Even archaeology has not remained untouched by these tendencies.

In the last decade, large-scale motorway excavations accompanied by novel technologies applied during fieldworks and assessments provided new opportunities for both the Hungarian and Croatian research. The international event aims to offer a platform to discuss separately achieved results within the frames of a round-table conference. It focuses on interpreting the archaeological record and the exchange of experiences of various scientific methods. The final purpose is to create a regional synthesis on a cross-border level.

All papers dealing with Prehistoric periods (from the Neolithic until the Roman Conquest) of the Baranya/Baranja region and neighboring areas are welcome, with special regards to the achievements of the last few years.

The language of the conference is English.

We cordially invite researchers to submit abstracts for papers.

Oral presentations should not exceed 20 minutes in length. Please submit abstracts for oral presentations no more than 300 words to
